CPE Frequently Asked Questions

What are CPE credits?

As defined by the National Association of State Board of Accountancy (NASBA), Continuing Professional Education (CPE) is a term used to describe the education activities that assist CPAs in achieving and maintaining quality in professional services.

How many credits can I receive for Ask the Fed[®]?

Ask the Fed[®] offers one (1) CPE credit per 50-minute session.

What is the delivery method and program level?

The delivery method is Group Live, and the program level is Intermediate.

What are the refund and cancellation policies?

Because **Ask the Fed[®]** is a free educational program, there is no refund policy or cancellation fee.

How do I obtain CPE (continuing professional education) Credits for Ask the Fed[®]?

To be eligible for CPE credit, participants must fulfill three (3) requirements:

- Register for the session
 - Please note registration closes once the call ends.
- Dial into and remain on the call
- Fill out the post-session survey within 48 hours of the call
 - The survey will ask if you want to receive a CPE credit for the session. Select “yes” and fill out the remaining information.

How and when will I receive my CPE credit?

Participants will receive their CPE certificate via e-mail one (1) week after the session.
