Adriana Kugler, Federal Reserve Board Governor

Governor Adriana D. Kugler took office as a member of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System on Sept. 13, 2023. She is currently on leave from Georgetown University, where she was a professor of public policy and economics and vice provost for faculty. Prior to her appointment at the Board, Dr. Kugler served as U.S. executive director of the World Bank Group. Previously she served as chief economist at the U.S. Department of Labor. Dr. Kugler was also a research associate for the National Bureau of Economic Research and the Center for the Study of Poverty and Inequality at Stanford University.
