**Q. What new features are available on your site?**

A. The new site offers:

- enhanced navigation,
- dynamic charts on the home page that provide a quick snapshot of what's going on in the economy,
- expanded regional branch information,
- additional audio and video features,
- RSS feeds, and
- an expanded selection of e-mail alert topics.

And there's much more to come in the months ahead!

**Q. How do the economic data charts work?**

A. Click on any of the charts on the home page to see an expanded historical view of key U.S. or St. Louis regional economic data. (Go to the Little Rock, Louisville or Memphis sections to see economic data charts specific for those regions.)

The expanded charts offer you a choice of display: 3D bar chart, regular bar chart and line chart. Mouse over the chart to see the precise data points. If you want to delve even deeper into the data represented in the homepage charts, just click on the [FRED® link](#) at the bottom of the page. Create longer-term charts in a variety of formats and parameters. You can also download the data files into spreadsheet format. FRED® data series and charts are provided free of charge.

**Q. Who is FRED®?**

A. FRED® stands for Federal Reserve Economic Data, and is one of the largest economic databases in the world.
